Performer takes jabs with knitting nuttiness

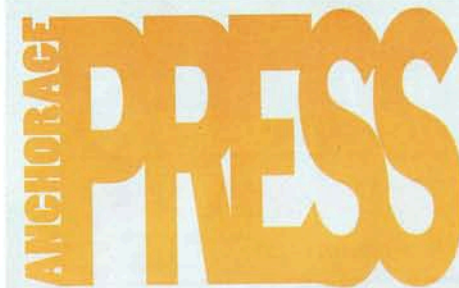
San Francisco performance artist Kristina Wong has flown into our arctic asylum to present "Wong Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest." In this wacky one-woman show she jokes, jabs and jangles politically correct nerve endings in a quirky, subversive exploration of the high incidence of mental illness among Asian-American women.

Wong makes serious points about life's absurdities by mixing humor, offbeat artistic activism and knitting metaphors. Honest, we're not needing you. Patrons are invited to knit during the show. In fact, if you show your knitting hooks or sticks at the door you'll receive a free skein of yarn to knit with during the performance.
